# INFANT 2

During the month of November, our class will talk a lot about thankfulness and the first Thanksgiving. We will be learning about the different foods that were brought by the Native Americans and the Pilgrims, and we'll be making cornbread!

Here's a look at our lesson plan for this month:

GROUP	Native Americans; Pilgrims; turkey life cycle
LESSONS	and environment; thankfulness
PRACTICAL LIFE	Toilet awareness: using the toilet; dressing and undressing. Watering plants; restoring work; grooming; Cooking: cornbread
COGNITIVE	Factbox matching (calcy); specific example view water
MANIPULATIVE	Feather matching (color); spooning cranberries; water transfer with sponges; paper tearing
LANGUAGE	Stories: My First Thanksgiving; My Thanksgiving Blessings; Spanish: Zoo animals and fall vocabulary
BIBLE	Verse: Psalm 118:1, "Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good. His love endures forever."
SENSORY	Corn shucking; turkey sensory bag; kinetic sand turkeys; Thanksgiving crafts

This month we will also focus on toilet awareness. The children will not only be learning how to listen to their bodies and practice using the toilet, but also how to dress and undress themselves. You can support this independence at home by inviting your child to help in the process of choosing their clothes and getting dressed.
