The story of Christmas and the birth of baby Jesus; Christmas around the world


Decorating a Christmas tree; serving snack; self-grooming; putting on coats and sweaters; watering plants

# TODDLER

Throughout the month of December, we will be embracing the Christmas season by singing carols, making crafts, and reading about the story of Christmas.

Here's a look at our full lesson plan:



Discussions about Christmas and the birth of baby Jesus; Christmas program rehearsal



Putting on coats; grooming; tending garden; making gingerbread cookies; sweeping and raking leaves



Decorating a Christmas tree; jingle bell spoon transferring; dancing to Christmas music;



Singing and listening to Christmas carols; Spanish: *Navidad* (Christmas); *Arbol de Navidad* (Christmas tree); *copo de nieve* (snowflake)

Making Christmas ornaments and wreaths; Christmas-themed paintings

You can help support your child's growing independence over the break by allowing them to put on their own clothes and shoes, walk independently (no more carrying), and encourage them to clean up after themselves. If they are potty training, keep it consistent.
