Spring is in the air, and we are excited! This month our children will learn about gardening, preparing the soil and planting, and spring insects. Take a look at the other great lessons we'll learn:

This month we will continue working on the independence skills our toddlers need to master in order to advance to the Primary class. The first of these is toilet training- using the toilet and wiping themselves. We'll also allow the child to practice undressing and dressing themselves after a toilet accident. Academically, we'll focus on the children knowing their full name and being able to recognize it in written form, as well as recognizing their colors. Please continue to work on these things at home too! You can also help by allowing your child to walk from the car to class in the mornings without carrying them.

Mastering these skills will help your child feel a sense of independence and pride in their abilities, which will benefit them greatly as they move into the higher academics of the Primary level soon.
